

## Update to BSUG January 2020

There have been a number of updates to the BSUG Database. In the main they relate to additional fields for the:

- Hospital where a Procedure took place
- Health care provider
- Product codes for equipment used
- New Preferences section on profile page (where you can add items to your own HealthCare provider and Places lists)
- Update to the Summary reports taking into account HealthCare providers and Places
- Persistent post-operative Pain - plus additional Report so users can identify which of their patients has ongoing pain.
- Type of sutures used for Colposuspension, Sacrospinous fixation and for Mesh attachment

The first thing to do is to update your PROFILE page. Note the New Tab here called **YOUR PREFERENCES**

- For certain procedures, such as Colposuspension (Open and Laparoscopic) and Sacrospinous Fixation, information regarding the type of sutures used will also be collected.






